
Since March of 2020, the Lehigh Valley Charter High School for the Arts (Charter Arts) has been operating within a three-phase Health and Safety plan to address the rapidly changing needs and evolving guidance related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our first Continuity of Education plan was approved in April 2020, and our first official Health and Safety plan was School Board approved in August. The Charter Arts School Board of Directors approved an updated version of our Health and Safety Plan in April 2021 before launching Plan B - our transition plan to move from fully remote to hybrid learning. These plans are linked below in the Resources section of this document. This document is our third Health and Safety Plan, outlining Plan C, a 100% return to in-person school for students and employees this fall 2021.

How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The health and safety of all Charter Arts students, employees, families, and the community at large remain a top priority for our School Board and school leadership. We plan to continue implementation of our three-phased approach as outlined in the graphic below, and we will continue to collaborate with our partners at St. Luke's and Colonial Intermediate Unit 20 (IU20), the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH), and the Bethlehem Health Bureau. Additionally, we plan to continue to monitor the websites, guidance, and resources these partners and the Center for Disease Control (CDC) provide to ensure that we are making decisions in the best interest of our students, employees, and community.

Our team will continue to monitor conditions and guidance related to COVID-19 as they are ever-evolving, and Charter Arts mitigation protocols are subject to change and will be revised accordingly by Administration when needed. Additionally, at any time during this school year, should the Charter Arts Administration recommend moving from one phase to another within our Health and Safety Plan, that will require School Board approval and resubmission of this plan to the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE). However, the School Board grants School Administration permission to adjust our day-to-day procedures to align with updated guidance, regional COVID case counts, and in consultation with our healthcare partners, without resubmission of this plan. In the event that our Administration recommends implementation of Plan B, the District of Residence attendance assignments will be revised and communicated to all stakeholders. Further, we will continue to keep our stakeholders informed as changes to this plan or schoolwide procedures are implemented.

To continue to keep our Charter Arts community safe, we respectfully request that all students and employees get a COVID vaccine and provide confirmation to our school nurse via email: nurse@charterarts.org.



## **Charter Arts Plan C Updated Details**

On July 9th, 2021, the CDC released new guidance for K-12 schools, reflected in our updates below.

- All students and employees will return to Charter Arts for in-person instruction five days a week.
- Charter Arts will not offer a hybrid or online option for school attendance in Plan C. All students and employees will be expected to be in person for teaching and learning.
- Masking is optional for all building occupants and encouraged for unvaccinated individuals.
   Guidelines may change based on evolving guidance from the CDC and DOH as we approach the start of the school year. The Administration reserves the right to update masking requirements as needed.
- Administration may opt to require universal masking in school due to any of the following considerations:
  - Increased or substantial community transmission of COVID-19 or a COVID-19 variant that is spread among children/adolescents or is causing a more severe COVID-19 illness in our local/regional area
  - Low vaccination rates among students, teachers, and/or staff
  - Response to community input from students, teachers, staff, and parents that masking for in-person instruction is preferred
- On district transportation, district bus drivers will monitor and enforce mask requirements.
- We will:
  - o strive to maintain 3 feet of physical distancing in all spaces when possible
  - strive to maintain 6 feet physical distance between unvaccinated individuals when participating in physical activity (i.e., dancing, singing, or playing instruments) when possible

- strive to maintain physical distancing during lunch periods to the maximum extent possible;
   depending on case counts and evolving guidance, students may eat in classrooms (as was the case during Plan B) or in the Commons.
- Charter Arts will resume Open Campus Access for 11 & 12th grade students in good standing as outlined in the Student/Family Handbook and per our parent/guardian written approval form. We reserve the right to amend Open Campus to include 10th-grade students in the second half of the school year.
- If they have not already done so, we encourage all students and employees to get a COVID-19 vaccine
  and, if they are vaccinated, to provide their vaccine records to our school nurse. Vaccines will keep our
  community safe and streamline contact tracing and communication efforts.
- Public performances will be held in person, both at Charter Arts and in the local community. Physical distancing for audience members and performers is encouraged. We plan to offer performances in a variety of formats, including live in-person, pre-recorded, and in some cases, live-streamed based on the nature of the event to maximize viewership when possible.
- Masks will be optional at performances and strongly recommended for unvaccinated individuals.
- Field trips and travel may resume. Departments will coordinate when applicable.
- When riding on Charter Arts school bus/van or other transportation service contracted by Charter arts, masks are required.
- In-person visiting artists, classroom speakers, and master classes may resume; distancing will be encouraged. Classroom visitors will be required to use the self-screener tool, and masks will be optional for visitors.

How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the student's academic needs and students' and employees' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

For the summer and 2021-2022 school year:

- All teaching employees have been approved for 10-15 hours of curriculum revision time to utilize this summer to address learning loss in their curriculum due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The school counseling team will continue to implement Suite 360, an interactive social and emotional
  wellness program for all students, and will track student completion and needs based on these learning
  modules.
- We will include an Advisory period in our daily schedule to implement a custom curriculum for students, based on Suite 360 data from 20-21 and the needs of our students gathered through written and oral feedback to allow for community building and discussion of topics introduced in the Suite 360 lessons related to mental health, wellness, executive functioning, and coping skills, etc.
- We have established a new Student Activities Coordinator position to focus on school spirit, culture, community, and wellness as we return to in-person instruction and interdisciplinary and school-wide student social interaction.
- We will continue to partner with outside organizations, including, but not limited to:
  - The Center for Humanistic Change (CHC) and Shanthi Project will provide family education at Back to School night and at other family engagement sessions to be scheduled throughout the year.
  - CHC will continue to be the supporting organization for our Student Assistance Program (SAP),
     which aims to identify and support students referred for additional support.
  - Established partnership with Lehigh University to provide a school psychologist and counseling intern as placements and need allow.
- We will maintain our partnership with CIU20 and regularly attend the administrative regional Emergency Preparedness meetings where conversations and solutions surrounding student mental health and wellbeing have become a top priority.

The table below further explains how Charter Arts will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other employees by aligning our procedures to guidance established by the CDC and PA DOH.

### the State and local If an individual is exposed to someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19, they must quarantine unless they are fully vaccinated and do not have symptoms. health Fully vaccinated individuals do not need to quarantine after being exposed (within 6 departments. ft for 15 minutes or more) to someone with COVID-19. Individuals must self-monitor for any possible symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days after exposure and report to the school nurse if symptoms occur. Unvaccinated individuals are recommended to quarantine at home for 14 days when they have been in close contact (less than 6 ft for 15 minutes or more) with someone who tested positive for COVID-19 unless they have had a positive case of COVID-19 in the past three months. Quarantine time can be shortened to 10 days if the individual no longer shows symptoms within 24 hours or seven days with a negative COVID 19 test result on day Students required to guarantine per the PA DOH must provide sufficient documentation to the nurse and attendance coordinator. Instructional access will be discussed with the family on a case-by-case basis. We will request that students and employees carry a mask with them during the school day. (Charter Arts will also keep a supply of disposable masks for community members if they need one for any reason). • If a student or employee exhibits symptoms of COVID-19, they will immediately mask (if not already masked) and report to the school nurse's office. Students will immediately isolate until dismissed. Students will only be released to parents/guardians, or student drivers may drive. Students presenting COVID symptoms will not be permitted on school/district transportation or go home via carpool to ensure the health and safety of others. Parents/guardians will be instructed to seek medical evaluation and testing for COVID-19. Symptomatic employees will be instructed to seek medical evaluation and testing. An area of the Nurse's Office will be designated as the sick room (room with resting cots). The door will remain closed while symptomatic students are in the room. Spaces will be cleaned immediately upon vacancy using the electrostatic sprayer and disinfectant. The certified school nurse, or their designee, will monitor the temperatures of any symptomatic students and employees. Symptomatic students who do not receive a COVID-19 test can return to school when fever-free (without medication) for three full days. When a student or employee, who has been in the building within two weeks, is diagnosed with COVID-19, Charter Arts will notify close contacts and possible exposures of the confirmed positive case according to the CDC guidelines. Diagnostic and Diagnostic testing is available at multiple local locations and is recommended for all persons with symptoms of COVID-19 (see resources below). screening testing Charter Arts is not currently utilizing random or direct screening testing for employees or students at the time of the approval of this document. On July 16th, 2021 the PA DOH announced their plans to implement a free, K-12 school-based testing program that will include several testing options at no cost to the school or families. Charter Arts plans to explore this option when more information is available and to opt-in to the testing program. We will communicate this information with our community as soon as we have more information about the DOH testing program. Efforts to provide Charter Arts promoted three opportunities to receive COVID vaccinations through the Bethlehem Health Bureau and notified families via our weekly eblast. vaccinations to The vaccine has been promoted to employees and students. school In partnership with CIU20, Charter Arts employees were provided the COVID-19 communities Vaccine during the 20-21 school year.
